


Ticket to School Project

Ticket to School Project

The project is being implemented in two parts

- 1. Make 1350 school uniforms for Makonjemare and Mbwana comprehensive schools. Learn! Foundation has
 - a) Identified and engaged 8 tailors from the local community who are making the uniforms. Uniform making will be completed in January 2025
 - b) Identified and engaged 2 Vocational training centres (Giriama and Upendo), who are learning tailoring skills with support from their tutors.
- 2. Empower Giriama tailoring vocational training students who are undergoing a tailoring course by:
 - a. Helping them internalise and perfect their dress making skills by allowing them to make school uniforms for the 2 schools children with guidance from their trainers.
 - b. Paying for their vocational training fee so that the can stay and complete their college without being sent home for lack of fee payment.
 - c. Purchase 20 machines for all trainees at Giriama vocational training centre. This will enable them go start their own tailoring business when they graduate by June 2025
 - d. Provide all graduates from the vocational centres with a sewing machine (business start up tools they will need to go start their own business). This they will receive upon graduation.
 - e) In 2024, 3 have graduated and have already received their machines and are running their businesses.

How the project has contributed to boosting local economy:



Learn! Foundation has purchased materials from a local shop



Has used local transport to ferry the materials to the tailors



Local tailors making the uniforms have earned a living including the employees they work with



Graduates from Vocational centres made their first uniforms giving them an opportunity to practice and perfect their sewing skills and people relation skills.



All students can now stay at the training centre without worrying about their college fee. They have an opportunity to acquire the skills without discontinuation.



Students who have completed their vocational training were each given start up tools (sewing machine) to enable them go start their business.



Ticket to School Project

1. Provide a special training for the graduates on how to start and manage a small business. 2. Teach the vocational training students and all tailors collaborating with us some life skills like time management, courtesy, smiling at customers, and financial literacy so that they can make their businesses grow.

6. Take measurements of the new and old learners that may have missed out in 2024 so as to make the uniforms for them
